

New Digital Leadership Program

In late 2024, ANZSOG will launch Public Leadership in the Digital Age, a new program aimed at senior public executives, to build knowledge and confidence around modern and ethical digital government, digital acumen and citizen-centric and place-based design. The program will provide public leaders with a grounding in modern public leadership at a time of transition and transformation driven by the combined impact of digital systems, data and Al. The program is being designed and piloted in consultation with university partners and governments.

The Professional Regulator

The Professional Regulator (TPR) program is Australia's first professional development program for regulators, designed and delivered by RegNet in partnership with the National Regulators Community of Practice (NRCoP) and the Australia New Zealand School of Government (ANZSOG).

The program provides professional development for regulators, regardless of regulatory sphere or jurisdiction, which results in a common foundation of current, modern regulatory practice, with increases professionalism and capacity of regulators around Australia.

The course is a practical six module online self-paced professional learning program. Participants will also have the unique opportunity to participate in a program of six seminars that will expand on the topics and themes explored in the six online modules.

The seminars are facilitated by expert regulators and provide opportunities for participants to meet and learn with peers.

INTERNATIONAL ENGAGEMENT

ANZSOG's international programs build understanding, relationships and shared learning between Australia, Aotearoa New Zealand and Indo-Pacific government partners.

Our international work spans:

- > developing executive development programs and partnerships with public services across the Indo-Pacific, delivered both in-country and in Australia
- > building institutional connections and practical collaboration, such as through curated inbound and outbound executive programs and facilitated dialogues
- > equipping Australia and Aotearoa New Zealand public service staff with the capabilities needed for effective international representation and engagement.

In 2023, ANZSOG returned to hosting delegations from governments of the Indo-Pacific region, including designing and delivering of a study mission to Australia for senior Vietnamese Government officials, and exchanging ideas with high level delegations from the Republic of Korea, Indonesia and China. ANZSOG representatives also visited Beijing to resume our long-standing relationship with the Chinese Central Party School, and have progressed discussions aimed at resuming programs with China.

ANZSOG is a member of the OECD Global Network of Schools of Government and our education and research programs engage and collaborate with leading global scholars.

FIRST NATIONS

ANZSOG seeks to build the capability of the public sector to engage effectively with First Nations communities and organisations. We are committed to embedding First Nations perspectives and values in our programs and conferences, where we create spaces for First Nations Peoples and government agencies to share their vision and experience of how to incorporate First Nations knowledge and values into the work of government and build genuine partnerships, their stories of success, including the challenges of the journey.

In 2022 ANZSOG established a First Nations Reference Group. This cross section of public servants, and academics from different sectors and jurisdictions, provides strategic advice to the organisation on our First Nations programs and strategies.

ANZSOG's First Peoples to All Peoples public administration conference in Brisbane in March 2023 attracted an audience of over 800 in-person and 300 online participants and featured over 20 First Nations speakers from Australia and Aotearoa New Zealand. These biennial conferences bring together public servants, academics, and First Nations community representatives from a range of sectors and jurisdictions. The 2023 conference announced the launch of the second ANZSOG First Nations scholarship and the winner commenced the ANZSOG EMPA in February 2024.

Our Research Model brings academics and governments together to address key issues. The three Research Model programs funded in 2023 examine leadership capability planning; trust, transparency and the use of data in informing policy responses; and factors in merit-based recruitment, promotion, and retention in the public sector.
