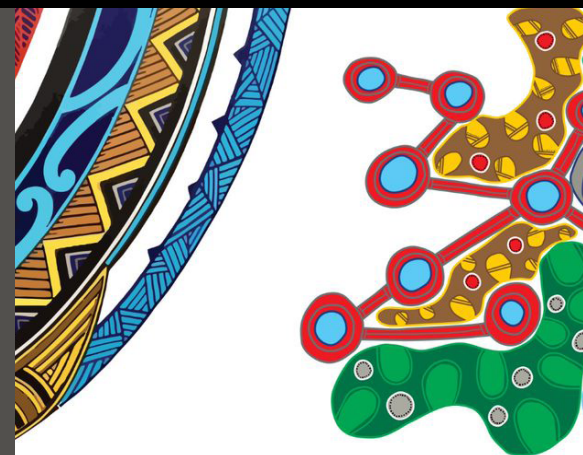

Working with First Nations: Delivering on the Priority Reforms



Take a meaningful step towards Closing the Gap.

Through the National Agreement on Closing the Gap, all Australian governments have committed to working in genuine partnership with Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander communities and engaging in the transformation of government organisations. To undertake this work, public servants need new skills and capabilities including: cultural responsiveness, engagement, co-design and co-production, place-based community development, and supporting communities to access, own and use data.

This program will guide participants through the National Agreement on Closing the Gap, demonstrate the skills required, and build participants' confidence in applying them in everyday work.

Learn about the significance of the 2020 National Agreement on Closing the Gap between the Coalition of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Peak Organisations and all Australian governments, and understand the Agreement's four Priority Reforms.

Build relationships that have real impact

Understand how to engage with and establish shared decision-making with First Nations people and communities, using approaches that are culturally responsive, genuinely co-designed, informed by place-based community development principles, and support First Nations communities to access, own and use their data.
