2002

National governments of Australia and New Zealand and state governments of New South Wales, Queensland and Victoria agree to establish ANZSOG. Further governments joined as follows: WA (2006) SA and NT (2008), Tas and ACT (2009)

Professor Allan Fels AO appointed as ANZSOG's foundation Dean



2004

Case Study Program established to provide a database of Australia and New Zealand-themed public sector cases available to teachers of public administration, now known as the John L. Alford Case Library



2007

Inaugural delivery of Pacific Advanced Executive (PACE) program



2011

Inaugural delivery of the China Advanced Leadership Program (CALP) which brought senior Chinese leaders to Australia and New Zealand. Reciprocal program began in 2013
