An invitation to exhibit

The National Regulators Community of Practice (NRCoP) and Australia and New Zealand School of Government (ANZSOG) is inviting prospective organisations to exhibit at the **2025 National Regulators Community of Practice National Conference (NRCoP)**.

With approximately 600 in person and 200 virtual attendees expected to attend, the hybrid (in-person and virtual) conference offers a valuable opportunity to showcase your organisation and connect with regulators from Australia and Aotearoa New Zealand.

The ANZSOG auspiced **2025 National Regulators Community of Practice Conference - Regulation 2025 to 2050: Disruption, Change and Continuity**, will be held on 27-28 August 2025 at the Brisbane Conference and Exhibition Centre in Meanjin, Brisbane.

The National Regulators Community of Practice (NRCoP) is an active network of over 7500 public sector regulators from all levels of government, regulatory sectors, professional backgrounds, roles, and levels of seniority, who are keen to learn from and with each other.

Its objectives are to support participants to become more professional and capable regulators and to promote the public value and importance of regulation as a key function of government and thereby, to deliver better citizen outcomes.

The NRCoP is governed by a national Steering Committee of senior regulators and it has local chapters in the Australian Capital Territory, New South Wales, Northern Territory, Queensland, South Australia, Tasmania, Victoria and Western Australia. The NRCoP also welcomes attendance by Aotearoa New Zealand regulators through its partnership with the Ministry for Regulation.

Delegates will hear from international and local speakers from both regulatory practitioner and academic backgrounds as they focus on new regulatory designs and approaches for adapting to disruption and change in an evolving and increasingly complex regulatory environment. The conference program will provide a mix of inspirational speakers and interactive activities, providing delegates with a range of opportunities to hear new ideas, contribute views and network with regulatory peers.

Key themes to be explored, include:

- Building trust and cooperation: is this the answer to delivering better regulatory outcomes in a complex world?
- What does AI hold for the future of regulation?
- First Nations Voices in, out and around regulatory practice
- Bridging policy and practice: what do regulatory stewardship and better regulation mean in practice?
- When things go wrong: is it regulator "failure", unreasonable expectations?
- From crisis to confidence: Navigating turbulent times with the global push for regulatory reform to boost efficiency





A dedicated online event platform will provide delegates with easy access to the program; speaker information; livestream sessions; sponsor profiles; exhibitor stand information and more. Delegates will also have opportunities to build connections during catering breaks, a network reception, a conference dinner and exhibitor displays.

Over 600 delegates are expected to attend in person, providing delegates with opportunities to network and make new connections. A virtual attendance option will also maximise accessibility.

Registrations are now open and we anticipate strong interest from employees who are currently employed by an organisation with a corporate membership of the National Regulators Community of Practice as well as non-members from the public, private or other sectors.

Acceptance of Terms and Conditions

Completing the ANZSOG Exhibitor Agreement Form is deemed acceptance of all terms and conditions.

Sponsorship(s) and/or booking of an exhibitor stand for the 2025 NRCoP National Conference is subject to approval by ANZSOG. Upon submission of the Exhibitor Agreement Form, ANZSOG will be in contact to discuss next steps.





Terms & conditions

- Information on entering a sponsorship arrangement thereafter referred to as a "Sponsorship" with ANZSOG, form part of these terms and conditions. Signing the Sponsorship Agreement Form is deemed acceptance of all ANZSOG terms and conditions.
- 2. Sponsorships with ANZSOG are open to all businesses, organisations and individuals deemed appropriate by ANZSOG.
- 3. Sponsorship candidates are subject to approval by the ANZSOG Project Team.
- 4. Interested parties are invited to forward a proposal to ANZSOG outlining the monetary and/or in-kind support that they are prepared to offer should it differ from the sponsorship opportunities outlined in this proposal. ANZSOG will review the received proposal and liaise with the named contact person.
- In the interests of maintaining a high ethical standing, ANZSOG will not accept monetary imbursement in exchange for brand exposure and promotion if such an exchange might result in adverse effects to ANZSOG or its partners and stakeholders.
- 6. Sponsorship(s) will not be accepted from any candidate whose products or services conflict with ANZSOG's Values.
- 7. Acceptance of a sponsorship candidate does not denote that ANZSOG endorses the product(s) or service(s) of the business, organisation and/or individual.
- 8. If for any reason the sponsored event is unable to occur as planned, including due to extreme weather, public safety concerns or any other causes beyond the control of ANZSOG, ANZSOG reserves the right in its sole discretion to retain any monetary contribution or in-kind support provided by the sponsor. In the interest of being fair and reasonable, ANZSOG will endeavour to either partially or wholly reimburse sponsorship contributions where the cancellation occurs in advance of event costs being incurred and will be determined on a case-by-case basis. Where sponsorship benefits have already been derived by the sponsor, ANZSOG may consider a partial reimbursement, however, is under no obligation to do so.
- 9. Any breach or perceived breach of the Sponsorship Terms and Conditions, or where the sponsor(s) business or personal behaviour conflicts with the ANZSOG Purpose, Values and Objectives entitles ANZSOG to immediately terminate the sponsorship without any obligation to make a pro-rata payment(s) of monetary or inkind support to the sponsor.
- 10. Where there has not been a breach of the Sponsorship Terms and Conditions, either party is permitted to terminate the Sponsorship where written notice is given two weeks in advance of the termination. Within this period, payments from the sponsor and sponsorship benefits to ANZSOG will continue as scheduled. Where two weeks' notice is not offered, either monetary reimbursement or in-kind support will be offered by the party initiating the sponsorship termination, the value or quantity of which will be determined by ANZSOG.
- 11. Unless otherwise offered as an agreed condition of the sponsorship, ANZSOG may engage multiple sponsors within the same industry for the event.
- 12. In the interest of transparency, ANZSOG is free to engage businesses, organisations, individuals and suppliers that directly or indirectly conduct business within the official sponsor(s) industry, for the provision of goods or services for the sponsored event.
- 13. The sponsorship benefits as outlined in the Sponsorship Opportunities or Sponsorship Proposal must be taken as offered and cannot be varied, unless otherwise approved by ANZSOG.
